

DRESS CODE POICES

The goal of Blythefield Country Club's dress code is not to impose sartorial judgment upon its members, but rather to instill a sense of professionalism and respectability in its members, and to maintain the positive reputation of the Club.

Club attire should be in good taste and reflect the "elegantly comfortable, tastefully casual" character of the Club. Members are responsible for the attire of their guests and their children, regardless of age.

The Blythefield Country Club staff and Board of Directors reserve the right to respectfully and discreetly enforce these dress code rules.



Clubhouse, J. Brewer's Dining Room, & Patio

Appropriate casual attire must be worn inside the Clubhouse, in the dining rooms, and on the outdoor patio. Denim without fraying or holes is permitted inside the clubhouse **with the exception of the Clock Room.** Gentlemen shall remove their hats while seated indoors. Bathing suits and workout attire are not permitted in the Clubhouse, dining rooms, or on the outdoor patio. Workout attire may only be worn in the Fitness Center.





Club Events & Holiday Brunches

Proper dress is required for all adults, children, and guests in attendance at Club social events and holiday brunches. The Club encourages its members to "dress to impress" and embrace the theme of the event (Kentucky Derby, Candlelight Dinner, et cetera). No jeans, crop tops, flip flops, sweatshirts/sweatpants, t-shirts, or other athletic clothing are allowed at social events, *with the exception of proper golf attire*.





Golf Attire for Ladies

Ladies should wear skirts, dresses, shorts, skorts, slacks/pants, or cropped pants. Skirts, skorts, and shorts should be mid-thigh length and provide full coverage when bending over.

Golf shirts must have a collar; blade collars, turtlenecks, or mock-necks are acceptable. Sleeveless shirts must have a collar, must cover the midriff, and must not be a Y racer-back style.

Please do not wear metal spikes.





Golf Attire for Gentlemen

Gentlemen should wear collared shirts tucked into pants or shorts. Pants and shorts **should not be** cargo-style with exterior or protruding pockets. Blade collars, turtlenecks, and mockneck shirts are acceptable. Hats and visors shall be worn brim forward and shall be removed while seated indoors.

Please do not wear metal spikes.





General Guidelines for Golf Attire

Attire not allowed on the golf course or practice facilities includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- Denim
- Hats other than golf-style headwear
- Ripped, torn, or dirty clothing
- Athletic wear: jogging/running shorts, sweatpants, sports jerseys, dri-fit t-shirts, hoodies, et cetera
- Exposed bra straps or undergarments
- Plunging necklines
- Swim attire

Swim Attire

Swimwear shall be appropriate for a family friendly facility. Shoes or sandals and cover-ups shall be worn outside the pool area.
